

Application for Accreditation as a Gateball Referee

1. Notify your State Coordinator you wish to become a Level 2 referee

Explain that you want to become a referee or upgrade from your existing level. Tell them that you are:

- over 16, have a personal copy of the latest gateball rules and a copy of the Q&A for the latest rules if this is available,
- have read and are aware of resources for GA referees located on Gateball Australia's website www.gateball.com.au> About Gateball>Officiating, Rules and Refereeing,
- agree you are bound by GA's Referee Accreditation and Reaccreditation Framework
- have read the ACA code of conduct for referees and agree to follow it
- give the name of either your club's GB coordinator or two players who support your request for accreditation

2 Complete courses and gain practical experience:

- Complete the online course, Community Officiating General Principles, available on the ASC website. Record the certificate number
- Attend courses or sessions about the rules run by Gateball Australia or your State organisation. These might be specially organised events, mentoring by existing referees or talks attended at competitions. Keep a list of these. Online course material also exists. See the GA website for links
- With support, referee at a number of events. Make sure this includes state or national championships appropriate for the level you are applying for.

3 Request your state coordinator of refereeing to undertake the practical and written exams

Provide details of:

- Courses completed (ie online courses or sessions attended in person.
- Community Officiating General Principles course completion certificate number
- Events you have refereed at.

Your state coordinator will organise a time for you to do the written and practical test that completes the accreditation process. Candidates in WA or Tasmania complete this process with the National Coordinator of Gateball until such time as there is a referee coordinator in those states.

Applicants wishing to become a Level 1 or International referee should discuss requirements with their State Coordinator
